

The Numbers

The proposed plan:

- Adds 113,500 square feet,
- Re-purposes 68,500 square feet,
- Constructs 20 new classrooms and numerous student support spaces,
- Reconfigures or expands 19 existing classrooms, and
- Accommodates an enrollment maximum of 2,000 students or the projected maximum enrollment for full build-out of Lake Forest, Lake Bluff, Knollwood, and unincorporated areas.

Reinvesting in Excellence: Proposed Plan

East Campus

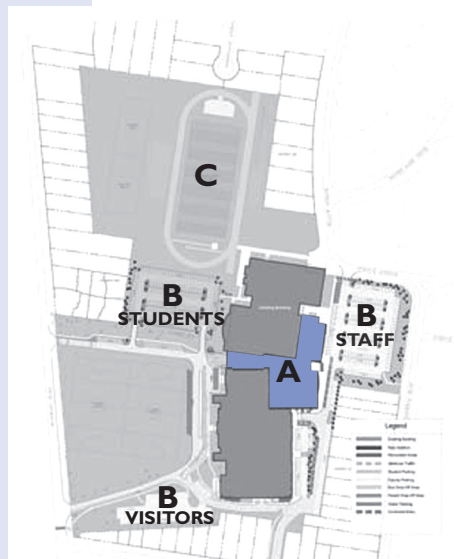
In keeping with the priority that our community places on the academic program, 85% of the proposed project or \$46.35 million will be spent on East Campus to support a competitive academic program and meet enrollment needs.

Academic Facility Improvements

- Add and renovate **classrooms** to address increasing enrollment and academic program improvements,
- Add **science labs** to offer extended lab access for all students – not just Advanced Placement students,
- Relocate, update, and **expand library and student resource centers** for enhanced academic use,
- Update and expand **technology** including multimedia production areas,
- Add **foreign language labs** to extend support of second language fluency,
- Update and relocate **music and practice spaces** to minimize sound disruption in academic classrooms,
- Improve spaces for **Special Student Services** and student support, and
- Upgrade and expand **student cafeteria**.

Safety & Security Improvements

- Limit and improve control of exterior **building access points**,
- Upgrade public safety (police and fire) **building access and evacuation** routes,
- Equip all academic areas with **sprinklers**,
- **Improve hallway traffic flow and sight lines** by connecting dead-end halls, stairways and corridors, and
- Improve **Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant ramping, access, and elevators** to meet current standards.



- A. New addition in blue - add and renovate spaces to address academic program improvements and enrollment needs. Reconfiguration also addresses internal safety and security concerns (access and evacuation routes) and provides sprinklers in all academic areas.
- B. Reconfigure parking to improve overall building safety and security by limiting and controlling points of public access.
- C. Transfer football program to West Campus (football field and track remain for wellness/physical education use). Reclaiming existing locker rooms frees up space at East Campus for academic use.
