Board of Education

Board of Education - Meeting Highlights

March, 2007

President's Report

Janet Nelson noted that the Board has been focused on the construction project. She thanked all who are working so hard to oversee the management of this project and for the measures in place to ensure the safety of the students and staff. Janet announced that the Board and Administration had met to discuss the Strategic Plan and the goal setting process. The group concluded that many aspects of the Strategic Plan had been accomplished. The areas that involved emotional wellness and independent learning were still under development. She indicated that the Board would complete the goal setting process in April and also conduct a self evaluation. Janet stated that the election for new board members will be held April 17 and the Board would reorganize at its May meeting.

Superintendent's Report

Dr. David Vick and Jim Dasso from the Lake Bluff District 65 Board of Education presented an overview of the upcoming LB elementary school referendum on the April 17 ballot. The Board is asking Lake Bluff residents to consider a six point master facility plan to build a new K-5 school and renovate infrastructure at the middle school.

Dr. Griffith presented information to the Board regarding the Job Shadowing program. He announced that a variety of activities have been scheduled for Earth Week (April 16-20). He also announced that the third annual Wall of Fame Induction Ceremony will be held April 10. Four recipients will be honored at that time. Dr. Griffith also announced that a Dimensions Task Force had been formed to investigate best practice for programs like Dimensions. The task force will include administrators, parents, teachers, and students. The task force will present a recommendation in the fall of 2007 for 2009 implementation. He also announced that he had met with representative's from the College of Lake County. They discussed a variety of partnerships, some of which include the college offering unique AP classes and dual credit programs.

Education Committee

Mary Ritter announced that the committee discussed departmental assessments and the standards for assessment. Dr. Cooley presented information about the Social/Emotional Initiative. Rebecca Leafman, Deer Path Middle School Assistant Principal, discussed what the middle school is doing in this area and articulation with the high school. The committee is investigating Chinese as a language offering in high school.

Finance Committee

Jim Carey noted that the committee met with the external auditors (Evans, Marshall, & Pease) and the district was presented a clean opinion on its financial statements. The auditors indicated there was no need for a management letter as no weaknesses were identified. The committee reviewed financial report formats and its investment policies. An external review was conducted by PMA and no changes were suggested.

Joint Shared Services (JSSC) Committee

Sharon Golan thanked Mary Andersen for hosting the Tri-District gathering for Board members from LFHS, Lake Forest District 67 and Lake Bluff District 65. The committee discussed the administrative move to West Campus. This move will provide additional classroom space at both the high school and at the Deer Path Campus. The committee also discussed flexible space at West Campus and the allocation of costs for both districts. A contract will be structured to reflect the committee's direction.

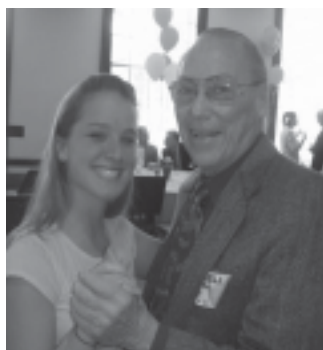

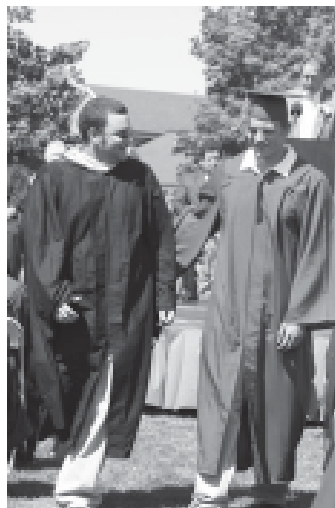

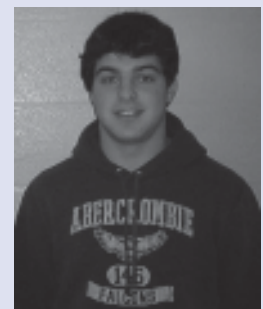

Law Honors meets Telecom

What do you get when you mix Law Honors Students with a group of Telecom Students...? A great learning experience with tremendous results done by all. In late February the Law Honors students of Mr. Matheson were asked to develop a storyboard for a Law topic. The goal of the assignment was to learn the details of their selected topic while also using video to teach about a unique aspect of the law. Some of the selected topics were Search and Seizure, Mapp v. Ohio, and Tinker v. Des Moines. After developing their ideas each group then worked with a telecom student to further enhance the idea, actually film it, and then edit a final draft. The telecom students of Mr. Douglass once again did incredible work in filming and editing these ideas from paper to a final video presentation. The students then gathered in the David Miller Theater to watching the final presentations of all the groups.

Business Education

The 4 P's of Marketing

The marketing students' of Mr. LaScala, Mr. Matheson, and Mr. Pulio worked on a recent activity to simulate the creation of their own restaurant business. In groups of three to five students per restaurant concept, they had to develop a marketing plan that included the Four P's essential to all marketing plans: Product, Price, Placement and Promotion. Target markets and marketing segmentation of demographics and psychographics were also studied and utilized in their plans. After creating poster board displays to show menu's, physical layouts (two classes worked with Mr. Barndts Advanced Architecture Class to create actual floor plans of their buildings), decorator schemes, and promotion plans, the presenters then invited additional business classes to the their trade show: The TASTE of LAKE FOREST. These student customers tasted the sample foods each restaurant made and then attended a "focus group" meeting to share their opinions on how well the marketing groups reached their teen target market.

Students celebrate Mardi Gras

Mardi Gras means “Fat Tuesday” and is celebrated on that day of the week. It takes place the day before Ash Wednesday, which marks the beginning of Lent. People “fatten” up and have fun before the Lenten fasting begins. The date of Mardi Gras can fall between February 3 and March 9 depending on the Lunar calendar, used by the Catholic Church to determine the date of Easter. This year Mardi Gras was celebrated on February 14.

Madame Sperling’s French classes celebrated this festive occasion by wearing authentic Mardi Gras masques and eating the traditional King Cake. A tiny plastic baby is placed inside the cake, and whoever finds the “baby” has luck for a year, rules for the day, and must supply the King Cake for the next year.



Reminder from the Dean’s office Lake Forest High school is a closed campus.

Students are expected to be on campus for the entire school day (7:50 am - 3:10 pm).

Absences

Parents need to seriously consider whether or not the reason for the student missing instructional time is warranted.

An absence can not be excused if a student leaves campus without prior parental notification to the attendance or health office.

If a student is to be excused for an important appointment during the school day, the following procedures must be followed:

Parental permission in the form of a note or phone call must be presented to the Attendance Office. A dismissal pass for the teacher will be issued to the student if he/she must leave during class. The student is responsible for securing the pass from the Attendance Office before that class period. **Lake Forest High School does not page students.** A student supervisor will be sent to a class for a student if necessary, however if a student is aware he/ she is leaving for an appointment and has secured a dismissal pass, the pass is handed to the teacher and the student then signs out at Attendance.

Whenever a messenger is sent to a classroom or a student must be reminded of a dismissal classroom instructions are interrupted. Students must sign out at the Attendance Office and sign in upon return.

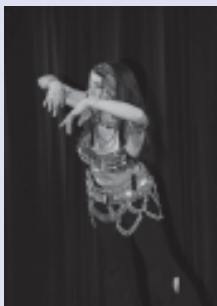
