



Lake Forest High School Plan to be Decided November 7 - Every Vote Counts!

On November 7, 2006 you will be asked to vote on a \$54 million building bond referendum to fund the renovation and expansion of Lake Forest High School's Academic East Campus and to improve portions of the West Campus facility and fields. Recognizing our communities' tradition of thoughtful preparation for the next generation of students, this comprehensive plan has been several years in the making. The plan reflects the findings of the Strategic Planning Committee, numerous citizen and staff planning groups, and the Board of Education. Since the last Lake Forest High School building referendum (16 years ago) educational methods to prepare students for college and beyond have changed significantly. Additionally, our enrollment has increased by over 63%. Lake Forest High School needs to remain current in order to prepare our students for life and work in an increasingly technological and competitive global economy. In developing the plan, educational objectives were defined, then architectural schematics were reviewed and streamlined until only those identified as essential remained. It is the Board of Education's unanimous position that the recommended improvements are necessary to keep Lake Forest High School academically competitive with other high-performing schools; are fiscally responsible; and provide a long-range plan for our students and community.

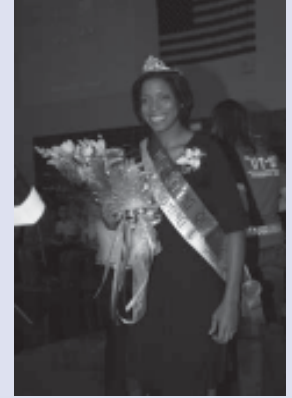

Debate Team

Student makes LFHS history at national debate tournament

It is not everyday that a LFHS student makes history, but this past summer, a member of the LFHS Debate Team did just that. At the National Forensics League National Tournament in Dallas, Texas, **Michael Educate**, a senior and president of the LFHS Debate Team, joined over 400 high school students from all across America to compete in the largest debate competition of the year. Michael reached semifinals and eventually the finals round, becoming the only Illinoisan to make it that far this year, as well as the only Lake Forester to ever reach finals in history. In the end, Michael Educate received 8th Place in the nation, after a total of thirty hours debating today's most controversial issues. But, he couldn't have done this by himself. On top of his successes in the tournament being unprecedented, Michael was actually disabled the entire time, suffering from an injured leg, and was forced to move around in a wheelchair and crutches. Accompanying him on the trip was Mr. Stan Eaton, a LFHS Debate judge.

The LFHS Debate Team is open to all students. Meetings are held every Tuesday after school in Room 240. The coaches are Mr. Richards and Ms Alexander.

- Attach a properly addressed envelope to the college or institution with every application (no postage necessary)

Art class finds perspective!

The goal is to accurately capture the grandeur of this David Adler structure, originally built in 1935.

Business Education spends time “Tinkering”

Lake Forest High School Business Management students are pictured trying to build the tallest tinker-toy towers with the resources provided (a fixed number of tinker-toys and students, as well as a five minute time frame). They are given a sheet showing how many pieces they will be receiving and have an average of 20 minutes to plan. They may not watch their competitor groups build until after they have completed their own tower.

Though seemingly simple, this activity introduces various degrees of some of the five functions of management which they’ve been studying: planning (setting goals and a means to achieve them), organizing (grouping related activities and assigning employees to them), controlling (comparing results to objectives and adjusting), leading (coaching and motivating) and staffing (determining the number of people, types of people and training them). Steve Forgette is the teacher for this class.

Food Service

New System allows Students to pay for lunch with their student IDs!

The cafeteria is pleased to announce that we have recently made available a **debit system** for the student full lunch line. This system is only available on the **full lunch line** at this time. The full lunch line guarantees that you will be served the \$3.50 meal that includes a choice of entrée, starch, vegetable, bread, dessert and milk. Next year we hope to incorporate it into the ala carte line as well.

Here is how the system works:

- Each student will have their own account to purchase this ticket. All **student ID** cards have a bar code on them and this will be used as their personal account. If their card has been lost or stolen, please report it to the Dean's office immediately.
- **Money can be deposited** into the students account in the cafeteria by using cash or a check. We would prefer that the student bring this in the cafeteria before school so we can enter the money while they are there. We will certainly accept checks at any time during the lunch time as long as their ID number is on the check. The money may not be available until the next day.
- **Each lunch will cost \$3.50** and you may buy as many lunches as you like. Once the deposit is made, the student may begin by merely swiping their card as they go through the lunch line. A balance on the account will show up on the register each time the card is used. You may call the cafeteria manager at any time to find out the balance on the account or to get a print out of the students account.

We hope that parents and students will enjoy the convenience of this system.

Please remember that this card can only be used with the complete lunch line only. It may not be used on individual items such as french fries.

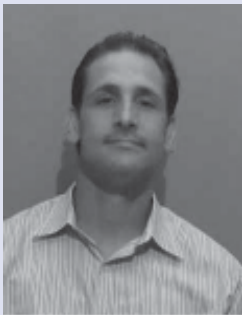

“The past isn’t dead, it’s not even past”... Two family legends connect in the present...

Every day during their social studies courses Lake Forest students are uncovering the continuing influence of history. One remarkable instance happened recently in **Tom Gigiano** and **Chris Bryant’s** Introduction to World Civilization course. As an assignment, students were to ask their parents for a family legend. Imagine Mr. Gigiano’s surprise when student, **Carolyn V.**, got up and shared her story about the sinking of the Eastland steamship on July 24, 1915.

On that day, thousands of Western Electric employees and their families had boarded the ship for a picnic. When the ship operators took out the ballast in order to make more room for the passengers, the Eastland started to tilt and eventually capsized. 844 people died. **Carolyn’s** family members, who owned a fruit and vegetable stand on the Chicago River, had thrown crates into the river helping save many who were drowning.

What surprised Mr. Gigiano? Well, it turns out that Mr. Gigiano’s family legend involved the Eastland, too. When the ship capsized, his great grandfather Frankie Caliendo was thrown overboard. He survived because he knew how to swim. In fact, like **Carolyn’s** ancestors, he too, saved lives. How? He put them on his back and swam to safety. But, could it be possible that Mr. Caliendo swam them ashore with the help of a crate thrown in the river by **Carolyn’s** ancestors? It’s hard to know, but it sure makes for an interesting discussion as to whether or not an LFHS student’s relative and an LFHS teacher’s relative were connected in some way to help others survive!

Lake Forest Core Team Professionals in High Demand!

Lake Forest High School Psychologists, **Cassie Black** and **Amy Gonzalez** have already served as guest presenters three times this year. On September 8 they were on the agenda for the *Illinois School Psychologists Intern Conference at Illinois State University*. They were joined by LFHS consultant and fellow psychologist **Madi Phillips**. Their topic was “Response to Intervention in the High School.” They talked about school-wide interventions such

as our writing and reading workshops in the English Department, targeted interventions such as the use of “Rewards” reading program in our Reading Skills course and intensive interventions used in the Social Academic Learning Program in the Special Education Department. On September 28 Cassie and Amy were joined by other Core Team members (see website/ Counseling and Student Services department), English teacher, **Maggie Forst**, and Special Education teacher, **Pam Johnson** for a presentation to Naperville District 203 high schools. Our Core Team members used a panel approach to answer questions that Naperville has regarding early implementation of a Problem Solving Model and “Response to Intervention.” Amy and Cassie also visited the West Suburban School Psychologist Association on October 27. The group included psychologists from the suburbs of Aurora, Elmhurst, Cicero, and Palos.
