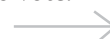

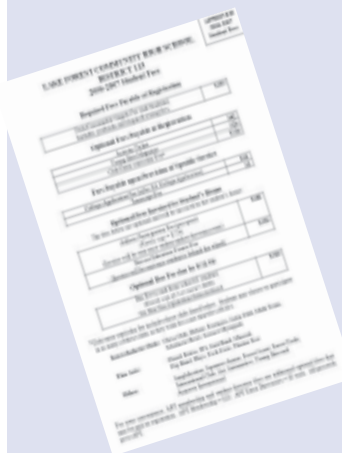

### Reminder from the Health Office

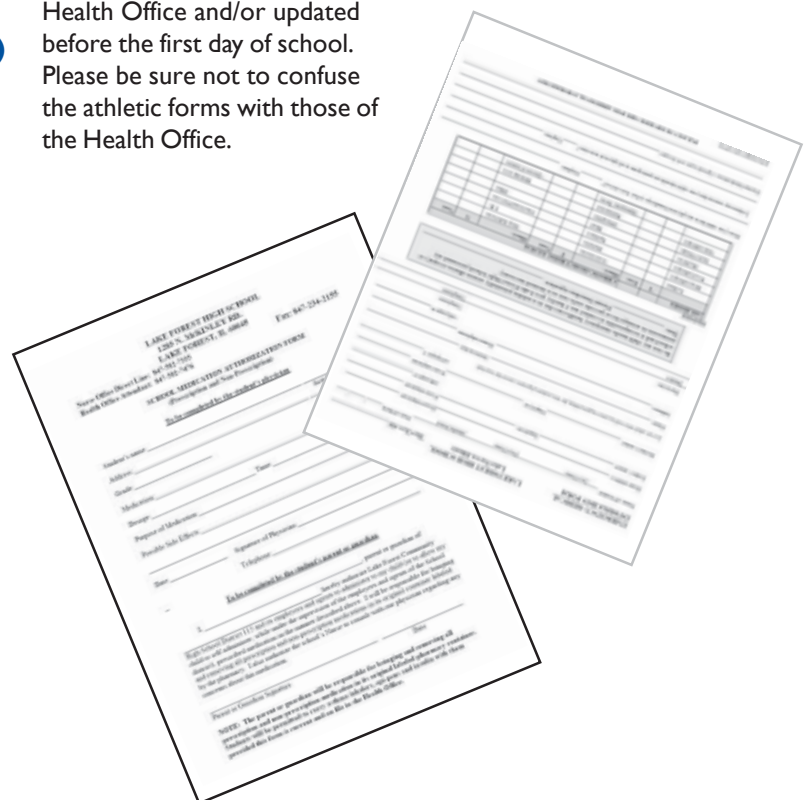

### LFHS Foundation Funds \$89,592 in Grant Requests in 2005-06

During its fifth year, the LFHS Foundation continues to grow in donor participation, grant requests, grant awards, and community awareness.
