President's Report

Sharon Golan reported that the Board would be announcing new Board member email addresses. The current e-mail system has not been very reliable. New addresses will be published on the school website (www.lfhs.org) and in future publications.

Superintendent's Report

It was announced that the Talent Show was a great success. Congratulations to the students, APT, parents and staff who participated in this sold out event. Upcoming events include the Senior Citizen Prom, which will be held at Dickenson Hall, and the Red Cross Blood Drive.

Jay Hoffmann announced that the student cafeteria will be closed in mid-April due to construction and it will be relocated to the Field House. More detailed information will be sent to parents and in the **Highlights**.

Booster Club President Tom Cox and Judy Telander, Let There Be Lights Campaign Chair, announced that funds (donations combined with Booster resources) had been secured to fully underwrite the lights for Scouts Varsity Field. Over 125 donors stepped forward to help make this initiative a reality. It is anticipated the lights will be installed and ready for the 2008-09 sports season. Thanks to all who so generously supported this campaign.

It was announced that one of our teachers, **Chris Bryant** donated a harpsichord to the high school. The Winter Choral Concert (March 19) will showcase the newly donated harpsichord as it highlights the musical literature that will be performed in Ireland by the Balladier and Forester Singers.

Dr. Griffith stated that two teachers from China will be coming to our community next year. One will work at Deer Path Middle School and one at the high school to support the Mandarin Chinese Culture Curriculum Initiative. A complete report will be presented at the April Board of Education meeting.

Little Scout Preschool Program

It was announced that Little Scouts, a full and half day preschool program plans to expand its program and relocate to West Campus in August 2008. In the past it served the staff of Lake Forest High School, Lake Forest District 67 and Lake Bluff District 65. With the relocation it will be able to expand and open its doors to the broader community. Employee registration is currently open and the general public registration begins April 5.

Wide Area Network

Cornelius DuBose presented information about a project that ties together the Wide Area Network (WAN) needs of Lake Forest School Districts 115, 67 and the City of Lake Forest. By participating in this project the schools will be able to create a multi-channel high speed WAN between East Campus, Deer Path Middle School and West Campus. It will also provide a connection to the City's LFTV studio facility and provide a reliable, scalable, and adaptable transport medium that is not dependent on low bandwidth leased lines.

Custodial Staffing

A plan was presented for the post-construction Buildings & Grounds staffing plan. Based on industry standards, the plan outlines additional staffing and funding to meet the needs of the expanded space at East Campus and Administration's move to West Campus.

The library book club, LFHS B & B, hosted two successful book discussions on Jodi Picoult's best selling novel "19 Minutes." The major plotline of this novel surrounds a shocking school shooting at a New England high school that devastates the community as they mourn the 10 victims and try to understand the motivation of the killer. Picoult was inspired to write this book after the Columbine Massacre of 2001 as she tried to understand not just the effects of the shootings, but more importantly the causes. This narrative beautifully explores all the factors that led to the protagonist's decision to aggressively address his pain. We had over 30 students participate in the discussions, 25 of whom attended the Jodi Picoult book event at the Gorton Community Center on March 12. Students heard the author read an excerpt from her new novel "Change of Heart" and address numerous questions about her books and the writing process. Students even had the opportunity to personally meet Picoult and have their books signed.

ACT Online Prep

The Illinois State Board of Education is providing ACT Online Prep to all school districts through 5-31-09. This program helps students prepare for taking the ACT by providing a preliminary diagnostic test and personalized study path to help students focus their preparation time. It also includes a comprehensive content review for the required English, Math, Reading, and Science tests. Students will be able to take (2) practice tests with questions taken from retired ACT tests. This program can be accessed anywhere, anytime via the Internet. PSAE Testing Juniors

This state mandated Prairie State Achievement Examination will be administered to all juniors at Lake Forest High School on April 23-24, 2008. The PSAE score is required to be on the transcript and is also a graduation requirement. The **ACT portion is on Wednesday, April 23** and includes the writing section. This ACT score is now being accepted by all colleges and universities this year as well as the NCAA Clearinghouse.

Student Physicals

Reminder! When scheduling your child's physical over the summer, be sure to take along a copy of the **Medication Authorization Form** (white) for the physician to sign. This form must be turned in annually and is necessary if you anticipate your child will need any non-prescription or prescription medication (e.g. aspirin, Tylenol, Ibuprofen) during the school day. No medication may be dispensed without this authorization on file. Copies were mailed home with course request confirmations recently. If you need a copy, contact the Health Office or this form can also be downloaded from the LFHS web page under Student Services/Health Services.

August 11 is deadline for Freshman Physical Forms!

LFHS has a first day exclusion policy for lack of immunizations and physical exams for freshman. We strongly urge all freshman physicals to be turned into the HEALTH OFFICE by August 11, 2008. Athletics begin on August 13, 2008. Due to the construction this summer, freshman medical forms can be turned in to the main office at LFHS. **DO NOT TURN INCOMING FRESHMAN PHYSICALS INTO THE ATHLETIC OFFICE.** The Health Office will forward a list of all compliant students to the Athletic Office in time for the first day of sports on August 13. Medication Guidelines for Students

Students who have diabetes, asthma or severe allergies are allowed to carry on their person in school: insulin, glucose, asthma inhalers, Benadryl and an Epi pen. However, a **Medication Authorization Form** must be on file in the Health Office. These forms are in the Health Office, Front Office or may be downloaded online at the school's web site. Applied Technology

Students create 3D prototypes

Students in CAD Engineering are experiencing the true benefits of creating a 3D prototype of a product. Students are asked to research an object, survey people about the object, make changes demanded by the survey, print the object in 3D and then test its effectiveness of the proposed changes. The class is using a \$22,000 3D printing machine made by ZCorp which was purchased last month.

The Lake Forest Foundation made this educational experience a possibility by donating \$20,000 towards the purchase of this 3D prototype printing machine.

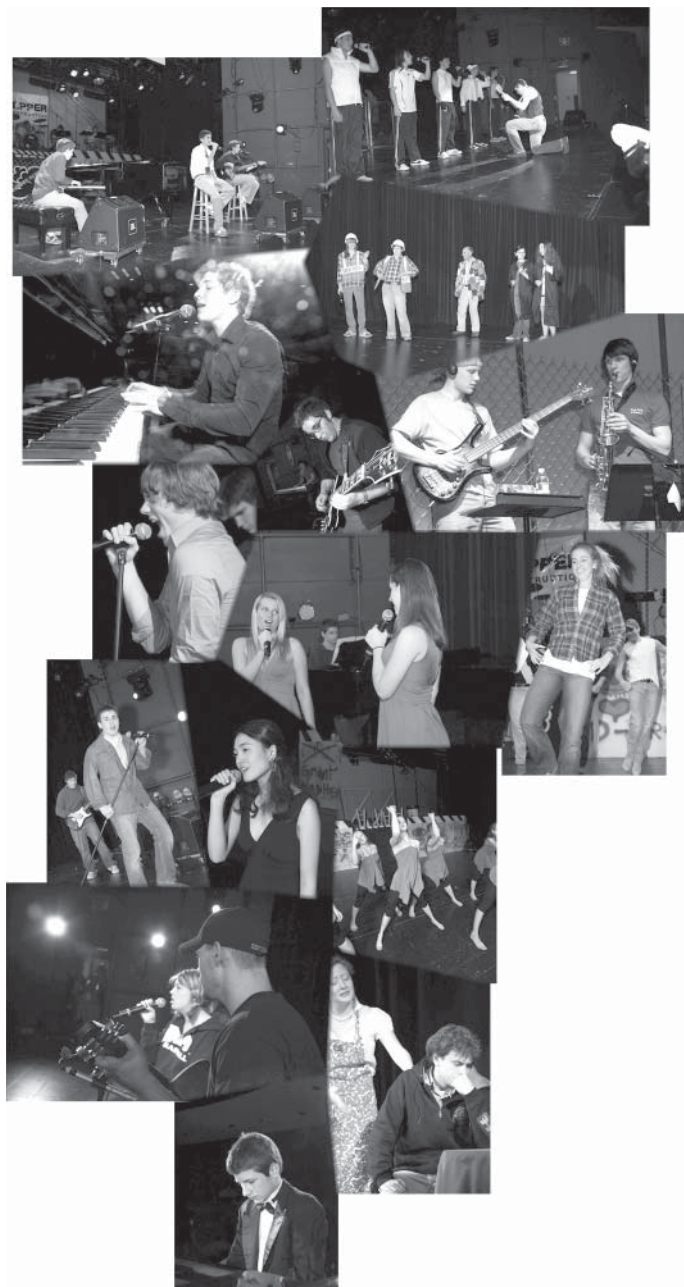

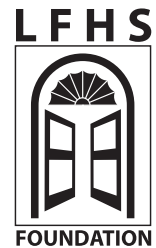

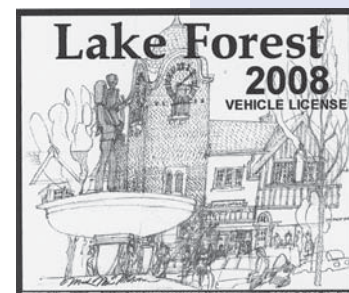
