Students may drop a semester course without penalty by November 16, 2007. Year-long courses may only be dropped by November 15, 2007 without penalty. If a student drops a fifth course, the student, including seniors, will be assigned to a study hall. For additional information, students are encouraged to see their counselor.

The Pass/No pass deadline is November 16 for this semester. This is a senior option only. A student must be enrolled in five classes including the one he/she is requesting for the Pass/No Pass option but not including physical education. If a student falls below five classes because of dropping a class, the Pass/No Pass option is null and void. Students must submit form signed by student and parent no later than November 16, 2007. Teachers are not made aware if a student chooses this option. Quarter and semester grades will be issued in the usual format. The letter “P” for Pass will appear on the transcript if the grade is “D-” or better at the end of the semester. A “P” has no impact on the GPA. The letters “NP” will appear on the transcript and will have no impact on the GPA and no credit will be earned, if the class is failed. The actual letter grade will appear on the student’s report card and can be recorded on the transcript by giving written notification to the Director of Counseling within one week of receiving

grades. Otherwise a “P” or “NP” will be recorded on the student’s transcript. If the student is a potential Division I athlete, it is important to make sure the course is not necessary for the NCAA Clearinghouse as they will not honor a Pass/No pass grade on a transcript. It is the student’s responsibility to check with any college or university to which she/he will, or have applied, regarding their policy on or perception of the Pass/No Pass option.
